Strategic Planning Reporting

Goal One – Maintain wellbeing of our students and staff as part of a caring community

- We held another successful Whanau Hui covering events planned for this year. To call another in term one 2020 to pickup on the aspects discussed at the first one this year including a "graduate profile" for our Maori students alongside that being worked on for all our students.
 - The group are planning a school Hangi in November funded by the Te Reo budget alongside sponsorship from Silver Farms. Each class will supply veges. It is intended to lift the Hangi in the early evening for families to attend as a community cultural celebration.
- Kapa Haka uniforms are the next focus which is being worked on by a small group from this Hui. We have \$500 available from grants for this along with \$200 raised in a raffle by the Whanau Group.
- Kapa Haka group are practising very hard on the FLAVA Festival in September. Fortunate to have musical expertise from Stevie Morgan.
 - Cathy Wright is invaluable in her ongoing support for Char with this group and also attends each week to help out. Char leading this area.
 - Kapa Haka performed on Friday at mass and performed today on Enviro schools visit. Great support from Stevie and Cathy Wright.

Action: Prizegiving – publically acknowledge at prizegiving.

Hold parent information evening through FOSJ with parent training in "Mindfulness" and "Strategies for easing Anxiety" with our parent coach.

We are now working on the details for this session.

Training for TA with ASD

Our teacher aides attended three sessions run by Thrive Aoraki to upskill them with dealing with students with different learning and behavioural needs. Bernie assisting delivery of these sessions. 66 teacher aides – very successful.

Principal and DP to take part in 5 day Mentoring and Coaching course with Mel Stopforth in Christchurch and onsite.

Brenna and Bernie have completed this course and found most valuable in giving tools when working with colleagues, students and parents. Plan to deliver this to the whole staff during 2020 as our in school PD. Appraisers advised Bernie to do the "master class" next year, dependent on the cost to the school.

Utilise one R unit to be used for Wellbeing release in discussion with staff and at discretion of Principal and DP. Proving to be most helpful for staff, particularly with emerging needs of students allowing staff time to undertake

more referrals, specific work based on individual needs and release when under pressure. The days grew to fifteen with the half DRS unit becoming available. We have some remaining to allow release for staff writing reports in Term 4. Use of units very appreciated by staff. Think seriously about having a wellbeing in budget for staff.

Social Worker in Schools

Following the escalation in student behavioural needs, have sought the support of TPS, Winchester, Arowhenua, Temuka Police and Family works to make a case for a Social Worker in Schools in our area. Sought support from MOE but received a negative reply after meeting with my senior advisor, with Grant Willocks.

In the interim Tenika Reihana, a parent here and qualified Mindfulness Coach, has approached Bernie to offer a programme for Term 4. Cost \$850 for a group of 10 students.

Remain confident Social Worker in Schools is going to happen.

Move we spend \$850 for the Mindfulness programme to fund 10 sessions once week.

Goal Two – Living and growing in our Catholic faith

In classes Yr 4-8 use Microsoft 365 as a tool for developing more personalised programmes to meet individual needs

- Bob has accessed a laptop package for parents needing to purchase BYOD laptops for 2020.
- We have some new school owned devises for those unable to afford this for their children and to provide this tool for Yr 4 students.
- FOSJ are funding five new IPADS for the junior school.

Investigate and learn about using PacT as tool in literacy learning as part of COL PD.

All staff have attended workshops with Rose R learning about the reading PacT tool.

Develop the outside areas around our new building to further develop play-based learning opportunities

- Continue to keep working on the play based areas with the boat now in place in a sea of stones thanks to Daniel Perham, a parent from Sicon.
- FOSJ have agreed to fund the storage shed for the STEM technology resources, which will be put in the top corner of the school.
- FOSJ have set \$7,500 for the play based areas so our small group will keep developing the ideas up to this budget.
- To look to having a "working bee" in Term 4 to resite and enlarge the jumping pit to use as a bike jump area, put in place (in concrete) some logs we have on site for stepping stones. From there we will look at building one obstacle at a time as funds permit, but meeting the H&S safe fall requirement. The three favoured by students are sensory swing, climbing wall, tyre swings. Stepping stones and long jump covered with working bee. Priority installing tyre swings.
- FOSJ agreed on spending \$300 per classroom per year and will be ongoing, IPADS purchased, Pay for storage shed, literacy toys and Bernie, Brenna, Sarah and Charlotte to spend the money in terms of what students

Question – would Temuka Transport fund planting? Option to look at grants.

Action: To note in next school and parish newsletter a list of plants people would like to donate.

Investigate further opportunities to take part in accessible play-based learning PD for junior syndicate

- The junior team are undertaking online modules on learning about Play Based learning as part of their CRT days.

Goal Three – Students thriving through engaging learning environment

Undertake some social action in our community as evidence of "Doing our Bit".

As part of Catholic Social Justice week have been teaching each class the nine principles of Catholic Social teaching. Our focus this year has been on Caring for the Environment with all classes going out into various areas in Temuka to clean up rubbish, with emphasis on connecting this to the Social teaching. Linked this to MM value for the week.

Seek 1-1 guidance from RE advisor, Cushla for DRS

- Bernie has worked with Cushla for an afternoon about our school direction, needs and challenges and attended a DRS meeting in Waimate.
- All our COL schools have enrolled to undertake a Diploma in RE paper in in 2020 on two TOD days with the assignments being more in line with classroom resources.
- Becs is attending a day in ChCh on 20 September for Catholic teachers.

Complete the building of the Kete Aronui as a place of tranquillity and prayer

Thanks to Scott for continuing to work away on this project with all the gardens ready to plant.

Yr 4 students undertake the Online RE Assessment test

NAG 3 – Personnel/EEO

Staff Report

- New Teacher Aide 40 hours received for a student for in class support. Short term contract. Kristen Holloway.

Investments to be held to be able to use as cash in interim until funding back paid for roll.
