- ♦ Sign in register for contact tracing for outside visitors and parents
- ♦ Water bottles instead of drinking fountains
- Three times daily cleaning of toilets, taps etc
- ♦ Daily sanitising of all classroom hard surfaces.
- ♦ Maintain space out of others "breath zone"
- Syndicate only liturgies and assemblies, with no adults invited unfortunately

Unfortunately, there are some school activities that we are unable to have as usual due to Alert 2 restrictions.

- ♦ Our combined cross-country event will be replaced with our own school event, time and date to be confirmed, along with conditions for adult attendance. Students will resume their Lock down training at school this week so please make sure your child has their sports gear and running shoes each day.
- ♦ Close contact sports such as rugby cannot be played at school at present but other sports such as basketball and netball can.
- ♦ There can be no school masses due to more that "ten" other adults being present.
- Our biannual science fair cannot proceed as per normal, but we are looking to share students learning with parents the same as we have always done, but in a different way!

These steps will be kept in place during Alert level 2.

At the end of this week we send out a term newsletter via class Facebook pages as we look to continue online contact as well as lessen our use of paper. However, if you would like a hard copy please ask your child teacher for one.






During the last seven weeks our world has been very different as we sheltered in our bubble.
